Location & Campuses

CMU is located in northern Thailand, in Chiang Mai province, a province fondly known as the 'Rose of the North'. The university is in a beautiful environment surrounded by a cultural and natural wonderland coupled with Chiang Mai city's ethnic diversity, a multitude of attractions and welcoming hospitality.

Since its establishment, Chiang Mai University has continued to expand and now encompasses 5 campuses;

1. **Suan Sak:** The main campus occupies an area of 615 acres (249 hectares). Here you will find the Office of the University and the faculties in the fields of Social Sciences, Science and Technology.
2. **Suan Dok:** The Health Sciences has a campus area of 110 acres (45 hectares).
3. **Mae Hea:** The 864-acre (350-hectare) campus is home to the faculties of Veterinary Medicine and Agro-Industry.
4. **Lamphun Sri Bua Baan:** The 1,890-acre (765-hectare) campus is close to Lamphun's industrial center.
5. **Samutsakorn:** The 10-acre (4-hectare) campus is in Samutsakorn Province, south of Bangkok.

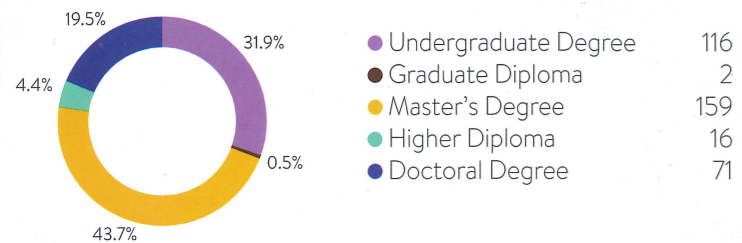

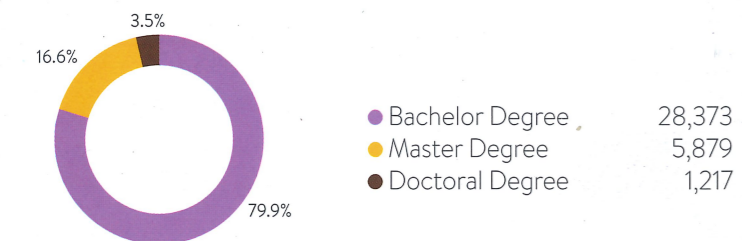

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Chiang Mai University

Chiang Mai University (CMU) was established in January 1964 and is the first university in the northern province. In response to the requirements and objectives of the northern people, it was founded to be a center for academic and occupational knowledge in order to benefit the region and the country as a whole.

The university is a place for knowledge collection, studies research and knowledge transfer based on academic freedom, moral and academic excellence, knowledge application and utilization, and arts and culture development.

Graduates from Chiang Mai University are encouraged to develop their independent learning skills so that they may continue to grow as knowledgeable, thoughtful and practical persons, as well as being able to manage themselves and other people, and work with ethical and social awareness.

CMU has earned a reputation as a veritable institution maintaining high academic standards and is also an established member of the ASEAN University Network, paving its way forward to be an important **Educational Hub** in the region. Locally CMU is acknowledged as the pre-eminent center for study in Northern Thailand and nationally it is recognized as one of the top three universities. It is also worth noting that CMU is ranked in the top 100 universities in Asia at 92 by the "QS Asian Universities Ranking 2015". These results demonstrate CMU's academic and research strength, a necessary prerequisite for CMU to achieve its development goal of becoming a research-oriented "World Class University."
